Dear Residents

We hope that by the time you receive this Newsletter you are enjoying some settled summer weather and are able to get out and about a bit more this year.

We have a few Staffing updates for you in that Jeff our Properties Manager will be retiring from this position at the end of August. We know you will agree that Jeff has been a superb Properties Manager for the Trust and will be a hard act to follow – however – we are confident that we have found in his replacement, another excellent Properties Manager! Nick Beresford is joining the Trust mid-way through August and before long, will be out and



about on site. Nick comes with a wealth of property-related and other experience having served in the military for a number of years and more recently in the Police force.

We are fortunate as a Trust in that we are not losing Jeff's expertise altogether though, as we are retaining him on a reduced contract with the specific responsibility of overseeing the Corfield Hall development project. You will be aware that we have suffered delays with progressing this project due in part to the pandemic but also to the introduction of phosphate mitigation legislation that has meant we are still awaiting final planning sign off. Considerable work is going on behind the scenes and we are hopeful that matters will be satisfactorily resolved in the coming months. The need for almshouse accommodation is greater than ever and we are looking forward to delivering additional housing for our beneficiaries.

As Government restrictions ease and we hope our lives slowly return to normal, please don't hesitate to make use of your Suggestion Boxes on site in order to communicate to us any ideas or concerns you may have regarding your housing provision.

A good news story....

In the office we have recently received an email, out of the blue from a local man advising us that his late mother had left the Trust £3,000 in her Will. His mother, a Miss Dollins was born in 1931, came from a poor family in Taunton and suffered from rickets as a child. The Taunton Town Charity (as the Trust was then called) funded Miss Dollins to get to Bishop Fox's Grammar School in the town.

Miss Dollins went on to have a family of her own, became a social worker and later in life, a successful property developer, which she continued well



into her eighties. Apparently she never forgot the help she had received from the Charity and wanted to give something back.

Emergency access - chain across the door

Trust Staff will only enter a Resident's flat, without permission, in an emergency situation.

Security can be maintained by using the door chains before opening doors to check on the identity of the caller before disengaging the chain. We would encourage that **chains are not left engaged** which again can hinder access by Staff or emergency responders in an emergency. **Only use the chain when answering the door.**

Residents are encouraged not to dead-lock their front door when they are at home.
